Connection to Care offers many Pfizer branded medicines shipped to the health care provider's office for free. To qualify patients must: have no prescription coverage or qualify for a hardship exception, meet the household income guidelines and live in the United States, Puerto Rico, or the US Virgin Islands.

Bridges to Access offers many Glaxo Smith Kline branded medicines for free. To qualify patients must meet the household income and eligibility guidelines. Note: Patients will have to have an advocate within the health care provider's office to complete the application.

The Together Rx Access® Card offers patients savings of 25 to 40 percent on brand-name prescription medicines and products. To qualify patients must meet eligibility requirements. Together Rx Access is accepted at many pharmacies.
